



Dr. Robert A. Hunt was born in Dallas, Texas, in 1955. He earned a B.A. in History from the University of Texas at Austin and a Master of Theology from Perkins School of Theology (SMU). After serving as associate pastor at Bethany UMC in Austin, he and his wife, Lilian, moved to Southeast Asia, where he taught at Seminary Theology Malaysia and participated in the Malay Bible translation project. He earned a Ph.D. in History from the University of Malaya, focusing on Bible translation and Christian-Muslim relations.

Dr. Hunt later taught World Religions at Trinity Theological College and served as pastor of the English-Speaking UMC in Vienna. Since 2004, he has been the Director of Global Theological Education and a Christian Mission and Interreligious Relations Professor at Perkins School of Theology, SMU.

He is also a Fellow of the Tower Center and the Hunt Institute and a board member of the Inclusive Economy Consortium. His research explores the intersection of artificial intelligence and human identity, and he lectures widely on AI, world religions, and interfaith dialogue. He is the author of several books and articles on interreligious engagement and contemporary Muslim movements.
